INTO

Introduction/Motivation/Focus Attention

- Tell students that we are going to learn to play a new game.
- Put on the ELMO or SmartBoard a copy of a Scategories board,
- Tell the students the object of the game is to write a word using the chunk they are given.
- For example for the chunk -ow. Ask students to think of a word that has that chunck in it. Like town.
- Tell the students that for each ending you want to come up with a word, before the timer goes off.
- Tell students the scorning system for each word that no one else has is 3 points. For each word that someone has is 1 point
- Tell students if they need to use the chunking Word wall for ideas.

Learning Activities (Input, Modeling, Check for Understanding, Guided Practice, Independent Practice)

- Play a game of scatergories. With one of the scatergoiers board.
- Have students work on their own to come up with words for each rime.
- After the timer has gone off which should be about 3-4 minutes.
- Start with one student and ask them to read the word they wrote. Ask the class if they have the same word. If they do tell students to put a + 1 point next to it.
- Continure for all of the other chunks.
- The student with the most points wins.
